Playground Committee to Host Facebook Live Events During The Big Payback







Nando's Burito and Taco Shop and Fairview Nutrition will each host a Facebook Live event during The Big Payback.

The Treehouse Playground is about to get a big boost from The Big Payback, a 24-hour online giving event from May 5 at 6 pm to May 6 at 6 pm. The Bowie Playground Build Committee is hosting a series of Facebook Live events during The Big Payback to encourage donations at certain times so they can qualify for cash prizes. One such event will be at Nando's Restaurant beginning at 6:00 pm on May 5th. Playground committee members will be there to encourage people to donate as soon after 6:00 pm as possible because the first organization to reach 50 unique donors wins the "People Get Ready" prize of \$1,500. The event will also highlight Nando's and encourage people to eat there because they are donating 10% of their sales all day on May 5 to the Playground Fund.

Another event will be early Thursday morning beginning at 5:40 to encourage people to donate as close to sunrise as possible. Sunrise is at 5:49 am, and the organization that receives a donation closest to that time will get the "Sunny Side Up" prize of \$1,000. Fairview Nutrition will be the site of another Facebook Live event beginning at 7:00 Thursday morning. The "Breakfast Club Mealtime

Prize" of \$1,000 goes to the organization that receives a donation closest to 7:30 am. Other events will focus on other prizes throughout the 24 hour period.

The overall goal for this year's Big Payback is to raise \$50,000 toward the building of a new inclusive playground in Bowie Nature Park. The group hopes to win the grand prize of \$5,000 for the most unique donors of any small organization. A "unique donor" refers to an individual donor, identified by their email address, who has not given to this organization before during this Big Payback. Update on Proposed Groves Development near Park

The Groves property development is on the Board of Commissioners' (BOC) agenda for this Thursday, May 6. The meeting begins at 7:00 pm. The developers have submitted an updated plan, the third one for this site. It shows a road running parallel to the park boundary, about 75' from the park. The 100' buffer mentioned by the developer at the April 1st meeting has come to mean a 75' buffer plus a road between the park and the boundary of the nearest lot. The new plan is an improvement over the last plan, which had a 25' buffer plus 10' of landscaping in the back yards of the lots. However, it does not include a 100 foot buffer. Another change is that the development is closer to the park boundary on the southeastern portion of the property, where it comes closest to the Redbud Trail in the park. It also appears that in two spots, streams flow through lots and into Bowie Park.

The lots bordering the Cox Run subdivision do not appear to have changed since the last version of the plan, nor has the 25' buffer shown on the north side of the development. The newest plan shows one more potential road connection compared with the previous plan, but

the initial access to the site will still be on a single road, Cox Run Drive. This will be the only access until either the properties to the east and west of the Groves property are developed, or until phase 5 of the Groves development itself is built, when construction of an entrance from Wayne's Lane is planned. That entrance requires the construction of a bridge.

The number of lots on this plan is 169, compared with 168 for the previous plan. This plan still includes a back entrance to the park. It is unclear who will patrol this entrance given the recent cutbacks in park staffing.




Concerns about this development are still storm runoff and flooding in the park and in the existing Cox Run subdivision to the north of the property; light and noise pollution; increased traffic through the Cox Run subdivision; and a second official park entrance without a plan to control it. The improvements from the earlier plan are the elimination of backyards in close proximity to the park, and an increase in the buffer along the park border from 25 feet to 75 feet.

The developers, Davis Drive Investments, are requesting a zoning change from RS40 (40,000 square foot lots, or about one acre) to R20 with a Planned Overlay Development (POD) which allows for lots as small as 10,000 square feet, or about ¼ acre. All but 20 of the lots shown on this plan are less than 20,000 square feet, which is the minimum size allowed for a straight R20 zoning. The overlay rules allow for the smaller sized lots in exchange for the developer preserving potentially buildable space as green space. The overlay rules also allow for more control of the site plan by the BOC. If the developer requested a straight R20 zoning, the BOC would need to vote yea or nay on the zoning change without ever seeing a plan.

The BOC voted yes to the requested zoning change in March. The next step in the process was a public hearing, which happened on April 1st. At the upcoming May 6th BOC meeting, the plan will get its final reading and vote. Anyone wishing to speak at this meeting needs to sign up for "citizen comments" before the meeting begins. Only five people are allowed to speak, and they are limited to 3 minutes each.

Plant Swap a Success after Postponement

Saturday May 1st was a gorgeous day for the Friends' annual plant swap. The event had been rescheduled from the previous Saturday due to rain. There were 10 vehicles and 23 participants.
